RIGHT CENTRIST HERVE MORIN WINS THE PRESIDENCY REGION OF NORMANDY WITH 44,2%

HE FOUNDED WORLD NORMANDY PEACE FORUM

According to the final results, the outgoing president's list (LR / UDI / MoDem) won 44.26% of the votes ahead of Mélanie Boulanger Socialist Left Alliance (PS-EELV / Gen.s) (26.18%), Nicolas Bay, of the RN party (Right extreme of Marine Le Pen) (19.52%) and Laurent Bonnaterre, of LREM, the Presidential majority of Emmanuel Macron (10.04%). When asked whether there was a problem of legitimacy given the strong abstention, Herve Morin replied: "In this case, we must stop democracy. We must then also ask the question about the presidential (2017, editor's note) because for the first time we had a head of state elected with far from 50% of the vote since there was a lot of abstention. " Hervé Morin acknowledged, him and his team will govern the region, in a united way with the other parties: "I extend my hand to everyone by nature to decide together, to build together.

I explained that my first list round will be my list of 2nd round. A framework of center and right but with people from different backgrounds. During the previous mandate, the opposition very often voted our deliberations. We are not going to relaunch discussions of political apparatuses. We will have a majority in the region. NORMANDY IS THE MOST FAMOUS REGION IN THE WORLD OVER WORLD NORMANDY PEACE FORUM----

Normandy is the most famous Region in the world because many notorious people are native to the Region, such as Thomas Pesquet, the french Astronaut, Christine Lagarde and Marcel Proust! It is also the in Normandy that Herve Morin founded the World Noramndy Peace forum, issuing the Global Peace Index. It is also in Normandy that "Format Normandy" a diplomatic quattuor for peace including France, Germany, Russia and Ukraine, was born.-----

Aquitaine-Limousin-Poitou-Charentes is the largest of the regions. With its 85,000 square kilometers, it is ten times the size of Corsica. The Languedoc-Rousillon-Midi-Pyrenees and Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes regions each represent the equivalent of Ireland, around 70,000 square kilometers. Alsace-Champagne-Ardenne-Lorraine is just behind with 57,000 square kilometers. Corsica is both the smallest and the least populated of the new regions. Ile-de-France is the second smallest on the new map, but it is by far the most populated. It has 12 million inhabitants, or nearly one in five French people. Ile-de-France largely dominates the ranking with a GDP of over 600 billion euros. It's huge, it's the equivalent of a country like Switzerland and it's three times more than the second on the podium, Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes.

THE BUDGETS OF THE REGIONS ARE ON AVERAGE € 2.2 BILLION-----

The regions operate on average with a budget of 2.2 billion euros. For example, the annual budget of the Hauts de France region in 2020 is € 3.45 billion, for Normandy: € 2.7 billion, for Ile de France, the budget is € 5 billion, and for the PACA region the annual budget is € 2.5 billion. When we add up the 13 budgets, we arrive at around 25 billion, which is hardly more than that of Catalonia. After the reform, we will therefore have larger regions, but not richer. And when we take the unemployment figures, it is Nord-Pas-de-Calais-Picardie that comes first with a rate of 12.5%, just ahead of Languedoc-Roussillon-Midi-Pyrénées (12%) and PACA (11.5%). The regions with the least unemployed are Ile-de-France, Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes, Brittany and Pays de la Loire with a rate of 8.8%. Source: French Regions.
